Consult with Larry Newton, State Office of Education, to determine if recommendations of the Engineering and Architecture Standing Committee regarding seismic peer review should be distributed, as a courtesy, to school officials who earlier interacted with the Commission regarding new school construction in Utah.

Walt Arabasz

Build a coalition of State agencies to help support a prioritized budget item for FY 2000 for a real-time earthquake information system. (If a related request put forward by the Utah Geological Survey for the governor's FY 1999 budget makes it into the budget, timetable for coalition building will be advanced).

Walt Arabasz/Bob Carey

Implement a USSC Web page for organizing and presenting information on earthquake hazards in Utah--and outlining ways to reduce earthquake losses. At the next USSC meeting, present an overview of proposed Web-page structure and potential resources for developing an effective Web page.
