Commissioners:

All

- Members for 1 year or more contribute a one-page personal and agency/organization perspective for the 2000-2004 USSC progress report by **June 24** once the report outline is distributed by Barry Welliver.
- Consider nominations for 2006 Chair and Vice Chair(s).

Carl Eriksson, Barry Welliver, Matt Cassel (also Steve Bartlett, Ron Dunn, Larry Reavely, Bob Carey, and Darlene Batatian and Andy Jensen, SLCounty),

- Continue work of the URM ad hoc committee to finalize legislative study resolution/USSC policy statement and URM White Paper listing USSC recommendations.

Barry Welliver-

- Prepare outline of 2000-2004 USSC progress report and distribute to Commissioners by early May.
- Complete draft 2000-2004 progress report by July 2005 meeting; complete final report by October 2005.

Staff:

- Distribute information on Boise WSSPC meeting at July USSC meeting.
- For 2006 or 2007, consider a “package” nomination for the Capitol, LDS Tabernacle, and U of U Marriott Library retrofits for a WSSPC award.
- Present concept for the Utah Earthquake Program poster for the 2005 WSSPC meeting at the July USSC meeting.
- UGS prepare a 1-page general public “translated” summary to explain ground-shaking maps.
- Advertise student grant program at secondary-school teacher workshops.
- Distribute Salt Lake, Weber, Davis, and Utah County IBC ground-shaking maps for posting/links on SEAU, ICC Utah sections, UGS, DES, UUSS, and USSC web sites and place notices of their availability in professional society newsletters. Print copies on demand.
- Consider hiring an intern (up to \$2500) to assist in preparing 2000-2004 USSC progress report.
- Report all Chairman-approved expenditures not voted on by the USSC at the following USSC meeting.
