### I. WELCOME

Representative Ray Nielsen, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:05 a.m., recognizing that a quorum was present.

# III. REVIEW OF INITIATIVE TO LEVERAGE INCREASED FEDERAL HOMELESS FUNDING - Dorothy Owen, Salt Lake County

Dorothy Owen distributed and discussed, "A Medicaid-Funded Case Management Program Targeted to the Homeless Population (a pilot project)" dated September 27, 1990. Ms. Owen also mentioned that DCED has information on Utah's Comprehensive Homeless Program.

### II. MINUTES

Mayor Tom Stocks moved the minutes be approved as submitted. Mayor Nyals Andreason seconded the motion. The motion carried.

# IV. PRESENTATION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY REVIEW COMMITTEE CONCEPT - Harold Carpenter State Data Processing Coordinator

Harold Carpenter distributed, "Local Government Information Technology Review Committee". The proposal is from the Governor's Telecommunications Task Force. Mr. Carpenter asked if the UACIR supports the creation of a Local Government Information Technology Review Committee. Also if the committee should include other people than local law enforcement representatives.

MOTION: Mayor Carole Scott moved that the council support the concept of the Technology Review Committee and that rural communities be able to have a voice. Commissioner William Bailey seconded the motion. The motion carried.

# V. REVIEW OF EARTHQUAKE TASK FORCE REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE STATE AND LOCAL INTERIM - Ray Nielsen, Chairman, UACIR

The task force made recommendation for Earthquake Legislation to the September meeting of the State and Local Affairs Committee. Senator Frances Farley asked what happened to her request made in a previous meeting to develop a price tag for earthquake items.

MOTION: Representative Max Young moved that the UGMS and the Task Force work with OPB to develop cost estimates of the priority list of earthquake items to aid in drafting legislation. The motion was seconded by Mayor Carole Scott. The motion carried.

MOTION: Representative Frank Knowlton moved that ACIR recommend legislation to: 1) create a seismic safety commission and 2) pursue the priorities determined by the task force. He included in his motion the concern that no specific bills can be endorsed sight unseen by ACIR at this time. The motion was seconded by Mayor Tom Stocks. The motion carried.

## VI. UPDATE ON STATE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLANNING - Dennis Downs, Director, Bureau of Solid and Hazardous Waste

Dennis Downs stated that he met with the Utah Association of Counties, Utah League of Cities and Towns and local health departments. He found disagreement among local officials about how to fund solid waste planning. The Solid and Hazardous Waste Committee has formed a working group to develop options in two areas: fees and general appropriations.

# VII. FOLLOW-UP TO SUMMIT CONFERENCE; UACIR BUILDING BLOCK REQUEST Michael Christensen, Executive Director, UACIR

Michael Christensen stated that Governor Bangerter has requested the Office of Planning and Budget (OPB) to do an analysis on the number and costs of mandates to local governments by the state. OPB is requesting \$12,000 to hire interns to study this issue.

MOTION: Mayor Tom Stocks moved that UACIR pursue National membership which costs \$6,000, with cost sharing as follows: \$3,000 from state, \$1,500 from Utah Association of Counties, \$1,500 from League of Cities and Towns. The council requests that representatives of Association of Counties, and League of Cities and Towns be contacted to consider this. The motion was seconded by Representative Franklin Knowlton. The motion carried.

### VIII. OTHER BUSINESS

There was no other business.
