Call to Order - Approval of August 15, 1990 Minutes

Chairman Bradshaw called the meeting to order at 2:17 p.m.

The minutes of the August 15, 1990 meeting were not approved because there was not a quorum present at that time.

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MOTION: Rep. Stephens moved that staff prepare legislation that would establish an executive branch commission within state government to administer the state's earthquake preparedness and response efforts, and to make a determination as to whether the commission should be within the Division of Comprehensive Emergency Management or the Department of Public Safety.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: Rep. Oscarson moved that the committee adopt as priority items, the recommendations presented by the Advisory Council on Intergovernmental Relations but withdrew the motion.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: Rep. Lyon moved that the committee adopt as No. One in priority Item # I. A. on the "Earthquake - Legislative Options" list. The motion was withdrawn.

Rep. Stephens motion passed unanimously with all members marked present at the meeting voting in favor.

Rep. LeBaron and Rep. Hunter commented that they felt inadequatly prepared to make priority decisions on this issue. Rep Bradshaw agreed. Sen. Leavitt suggested that the role of an earthquake preparedness commission should be to study the issues and make priority recommendations.

MOTION: Rep. Hunter moved that the committee accept the recommendations of the Utah Advisory Council for Intergovernmental Relations Earthquake. The motion passed unanimously with all members marked present at the meeting voting in favor.

James Tingey, Utah Comprehensive Emergency Management, informed the committee that in California in 1971, earthquake response was misdirected to the wrong area due to a lack of adequate surveillance equipment. In that respect, Dr. Arabasz, University of Utah Seismograph Station, pointed out that unless funding requests were granted for instrumentation to properly monitor earthquakes, the university would find it necessary to redirect their efforts to research.

Rep. Lyon voiced the opinion that it was impossible to make a prioritization list without knowing what the costs to implement them would be.

MOTION: Sen. Cornaby made the motion to instruct Mike Christensen, Office of Planning and Budget, to put a dollar amount on each of the Earthquake Advisory Council's recommendations and report back to the committee in their October meeting. The motion passed unanimously with all members marked present at the meeting voting in favor.

4. <u>Underground Storage Tanks</u>

A Geographic Information Systems visual display was presented that showed all the underground storage tanks in Salt Lake County and their relationship to other geographical features. David Fletcher, Department of Administrative Services, reviewed a proposal (copy on file in the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel) that outlined procedures to comply with EPA regulations. One of the proposals was the formation of a

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Rep. Holmes suggested that the bill had merit and was a position that the committee should well consider. He raised the issue that if there was an overwhelming number of representatives from government agencies, the public may not be fairly represented. Rep. Lyon countered that she felt the bill was overly restrictive and ultimately would hurt the welfare of the people in the state. Rep. Jones agreed.

No action was taken on the bill.

7. Other Business

Chairman Bradshaw asked for the names of those that were planning to attend the Utah Vision Conference, at the University of Utah on Tuesday, September 25 at 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. Rep. Jones, Rep. Lyon, Rep. Holmes, Rep. Haverson, and Rep. Evans indicated that they would be attending.

8. Adjourn

MOTION: Rep. Evans moved that the meeting adjourn. The motion passed unanimously with all members marked present at the meeting voting in favor.

The meeting adjourned at 5:00 p.m.

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
