## Welcome and Introduction of Members and Visitors/Approval of Minutes

**Keith Koper** asked for introductions and invited attendees to introduce themselves. He asked for a review of the minutes.

## New Wasatch Front Earthquake Scenario Document Update

**Divya** provided an overview and held a discussion on the new Wasatch Front Earthquake Scenario Document and held a discussion regarding the needs of the scenario. She discussed the process and needs of the people who will be using the scenario. She discussed the roadmap and discussed identifying the right agencies to include in the collaboration. She discussed the importance of the roadmap and funding and stakeholder engagement. The Commission discussed including Envision Utah and agreed to engage them with stakeholder involvement. Divya requested feedback from the Commission and invited additional participation.

# Utah State University Earthquake-Related Legislative Appropriation Update

**Brady Cox** provided a presentation on Utah State University's Legislative appropriation for the Utah Earthquake Engineering Center. He discussed his earthquake engineering experiences and education. He provided background and the value and need for a Utah Earthquake Engineering Center. He discussed Utah as having significant seismic risk, but that Utah didn't have an engineering center. In March they were granted \$2.5 million to start an Earthquake Engineering Research Center. He discussed Utah's significant seismic hazard and the importance of a deeper look at the building code and design for ground motions. He discussed Education and training, education solutions, and resilient recovery as the goals of the Utah Earthquake Engineering Center.

## Legislative and Governor's Office Update

**Evan Curtis** provided a Legislative and Governor's Office update. He discussed the revenue surpluses and appropriations which are much more from previous years. He discussed Utah's excellent economy. He discussed Utah being a well-managed state and the continued investments in infrastructure. He complimented the Commission for their involvement and assistance in getting investments to improve infrastructure. The state is updating long-term updates.

**Kris Hamlet** added that the Legislature added money to ongoing funding for emergency management and the State Disaster Account. He discussed SB-33 as the local disaster account and its many benefits to communities. He mentioned the updated fire code and the building code adoptions by the Legislature.

**Ari Bruening** thanked everyone in the Commission for all their efforts to get unprecedented funding for earthquake safety. He discussed the unprecedented funding for earthquake mitigation.

**Rhett Larsen** discussed funding to LEAs for school safety. He discussed the schools, and all the competing problems school administrators are presented. He mentioned the criticality of keeping earthquake mitigation funding in the discussion.

# Grant Updates from Envision Utah and for the Unreinforced Masonry (URM) Guide

**Ember Herrick** discussed a variety of HMGP projects and provided details regarding the Unreinforced Masonry (URM) Guide and ATC. She discussed the HMGP grant to Envision Utah. These grants significantly help Utah communities become more prepared.

## Progress Report on Schools and Outreach to Utah School Districts, the National Earthquake Program Managers Meeting, and the Great Utah ShakeOut

John Crofts provided an update on the translation in Spanish for Putting Down Roots. He provided a brief overview of the K-12 URM Inventory, the unacceptable risk to Utah students, continued outreach to the school districts, and the upcoming outreach and workshop to the school districts. The Utah Great Shakeout had over 900,000 participants. He discussed the National Earthquake Program Managers Meeting and the Utah Shakeout. He thanked the Commissioners for their service and unrecognized contributions. Utah's Seismic Safety commissions is an example to the Nation, and other states are requesting information on how to improve and implement similar commissions in their own states and territories.

## Cascadia Region Earthquake Workshop, the Western States Seismic Policy Council, and Various Seismic Safety Commission

**Pascal Schuback** provided the Commission with a review of the Cascadia Region Earthquake Workshop, and the expiration of the Western States Seismic Safety Policy Council, and discussed various seismic safety Commission joint efforts and updates.

The Commission agreed to hold the next Commission meeting on July 6, 2023. The meeting will be a hybrid meeting and details will follow.
