Agenda for discussion of the "Strategic Plan" document
October 6, 1994 USSC meeting

1. Summary of general review comments:
 - A. From the California Seismic Safety Commission:
 - Set specific goals (tasks?) and timelines for strategies.
 - Prioritize and concentrate on completing a few strategies.
 - Emphasize applied over basic research.
 - Don't divide strategies by professional expertise, but list expertise needed to meet strategy.
 - B. From FEMA (Richard Moore):
 - Set priorities.
 - Resource needs for each strategy should be identified.
 - FEMA has publications addressing many strategies already.
 - C. From Newland Malmquist (structural engineer):
 - The heavy reliance on government agencies should be diversified by including professional societies such as ASCE, ASME, IEEE, EERI, etc.
 - D. From Thair Blackburn (architect): Mr. Blackburn questions some fundamental premises of the document, including that:
 - "government has a mandate to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens" (Strat. Plan p. 1 and 14, Blackburn comments p. 1).
 - "there is a critical need for hazard-reduction measures, including ... proper seismic-structural design and construction of buildings." (Strat. Plan p. 32; Blackburn comments p. 4).
2. Comments on strategies (compiled for each objective).
3. Discuss presentation to State and Local Affairs Committee.
4. Final document; number of copies, costs, color cover?
 - A. How many should be printed, and who should get them?
 - i. 165 drafts were mailed out.
 - ii. Document will have long-term value.
 - B. Should the cover be a color photograph?
 - i. Cost for 500 copies:
 - full color cover on glossy stock: \$1675-1720
 - two color cover on light colored stock: \$1500-1540
 - black and white cover on light colored stock: \$1440-1465
4. Who should publish the document?
 - A. USSC only, with no publisher.
 - B. USSC, published by UGS in a UGS publication series.
 - i. Eventually for sale in the UGS Bookstore, after initial distribution.
